Low Carbon Landscapes grants will fund the initial stages of project development for landscape-scale, high quality carbon abatement projects in the primary industries and land sector, up to the point where they are able to secure investment.

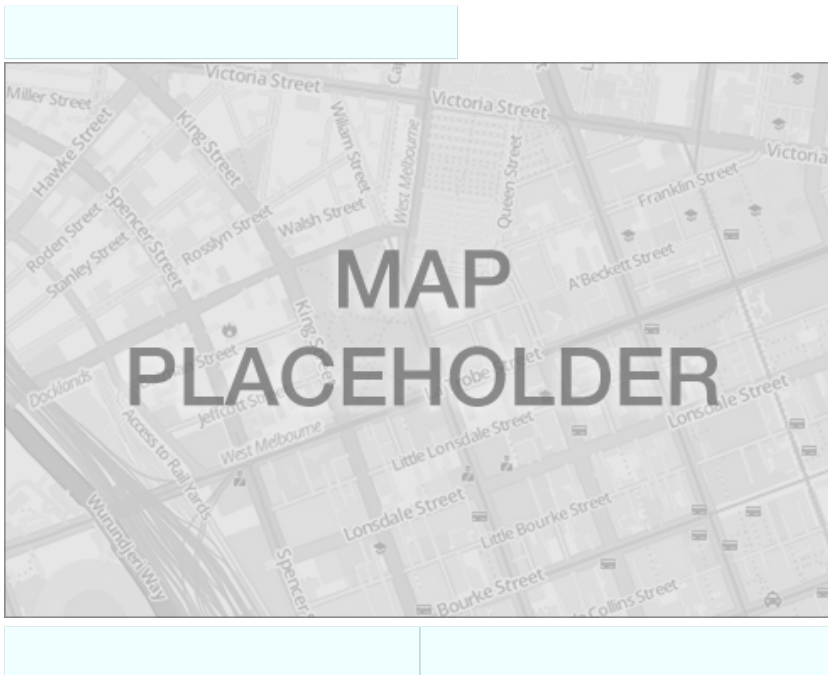

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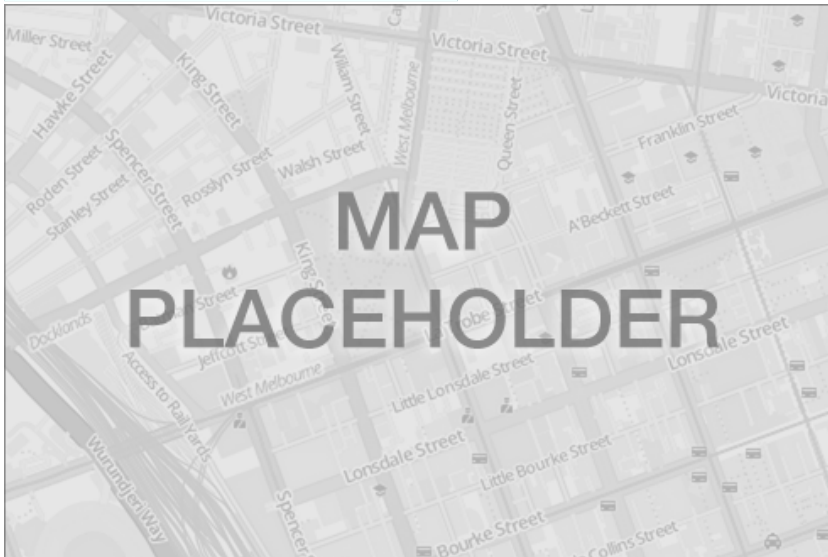

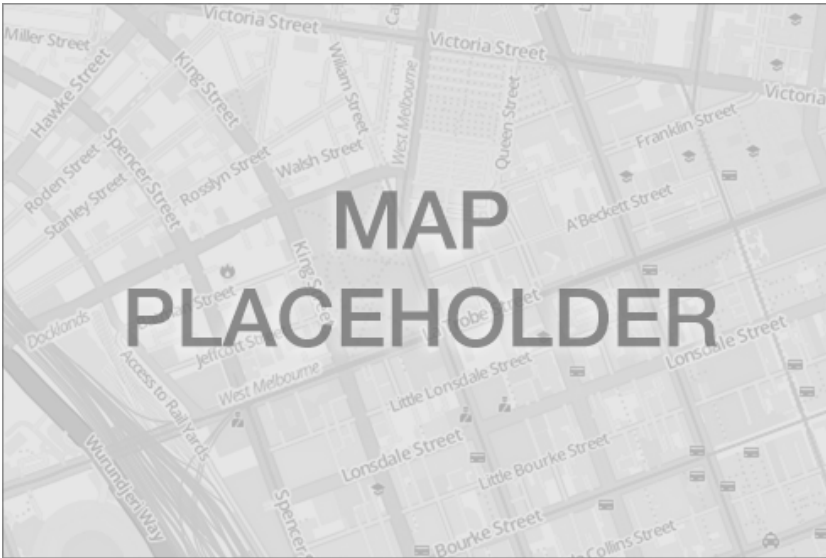
